Originally created to help students in rural Nebraska fulfill graduation requirements, the <u>University of Nebraska High</u> <u>School (UNHS)</u> provided its first correspondence courses in 1929. As the school grew, it expanded its service to students throughout the United States and the world.

UNHS was the first distance education high school to receive regional accreditation. It awarded its first diploma to a student in West Germany in 1968, and moved online in 2001 to provide better access to students worldwide.

UNHS is part of the University of Nebraska system, which serves more than 50,000 students across four campuses with undergraduate through doctoral programs.
